We are proud to announce that Montville Township now ranks the 6th safest place to live in Ohio.

We have been working hard these past six years to foster a sense of community with annual events here in Montville Township. Each year, we hold an Easter Egg Hunt around Easter and a Trunk R Treat/Scary/Spooky Walk at Cobblestone Park - this year scheduled for October 20th. Both of these events are well attended.

Our volunteer community events planning committee – Montville Cares – orchestrates both events and is always recruiting help and new members. Call Rebecca Byrne at 330-661-0123 if you would like to get involved.

Badger Lodge is our second and newest community room with chairs for 30 people and a capacity of 69 standing. Located in the Spokes 2 Café building, this room is available to the community for a small fee and refundable security deposit. It's a great location for outdoor events since it is adjacent to the Austin Badger Fitness Park on River Styx Road. There is also a community room available for rent in our Safety Services building that can seat up to 48 people with a standing capacity of 95.

Montville Township also has pavilions available for use for community events and these are located at our other two parks: Whitetail and Cobblestone. All of these buildings are used regularly by our residents for meetings, showers, scouting, parties and family reunions. # Completing Normandy Park Drive Road Reconstruction

The job to complete and resurface Normandy Park Drive was awarded to Liberta Construction Company. They will begin October 1st and have a promised completion date of October 15th, 2018. This road project began earlier this year by LRC, the contractors in charge of the new GetGo, Chipotle, Verizon and Starbucks project where they constructed a new east lane for their businesses and reconstructed a new middle lane.

Montville Township received a TID grant which will pay for 25% of their portion of the upcoming west side lane. Discussions were held with McDonalds to relocate their entrance further from the Route 18 intersection, however, they could not justify the additional cost at this time as McDonald restaurants across the nation are undergoing corporate mandated renovations.

Montville Township worked in collaboration with the county to repave our side of Smith Road. West of River Styx on Smith Road, is a reconstruction to the curves by Champion Creek and Chandlers Farm and is all funded by the county. Thanks for your patience as these repairs are made.

# Montville Township Citizens Police Academy

We believe that we strengthen relationships with our citizens when we educate them on what our departments do on a daily basis. The Citizens Policy Academy is a free program that allows officers and residents to have conversations in an informal setting where both learn from one another. The current program began on September 5th and runs 10 weeks until November 7th, 2018, covering topics such as: emergency communications, mutual aid, domestic violence, human trafficking, use of force, drug and K9 demonstration, drug court, juvenile court system, jail and SWAT tour, field sobriety, and a decision making class.

In the Fall, typical building trends start to slow down, however, with the recent burst of warm weather, many decks, patios and accessory buildings projects have had permits issued. Many residents report receiving great deals on end of summer pricing.

Montville residents will soon have the luxury of dining at Blue Heron Brewery and Event Center located within the Blue Heron Subdivision on Blue Heron Trace. The restaurant/brewery is hoping to open this winter.

The west side of Montville on Wooster Pike will host a new Dunkin Donuts. The restaurant will be located north of Mr. Tire and south of Trillium Creek. The

plans are under review and construction could start as early as the late fall.

Over the previous months, the Zoning Commission has reviewed, amended, and added language to the Montville Township Zoning Resolution. There has also been a Zoning Map amendment, that changed the zoning districts on the west side of Wooster Pike from Community Business (CB) to Suburban Residential (R2). Some of the topics that have been added or amended are agritourism, definitions, and enforcement time frames. By staying on top of these issues and projected matters, we are able to create a code that keeps Montville a wonderful place to live.

# Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities Receives 100%

Recently the Medina County Board of Developmental Disabilities (MCBDD) was reviewed by the Ohio Department of DD to evaluate the

agency's daily operations, processes and ability to help people with developmental disabilities become engaged within the community. The review covered 371 areas of the Ohio Administrative Code, 53 documentation requirements, and approximately 830 operational areas. The MCBDD received a 100% compliance rate in all areas, a rare achievement, and was issued a three year certificate of accreditation, the highest an organization may receive. MCBDD Assistant Superintendent Annie Finnerty, who is responsible for managing all compliance and quality assurance for the agency stated, "This outstanding achievement shows that the MCBDD continues to be true to its mission of empowering families and people with developmental disabilities." The Medina County Board of DD is the community resource responsible for connecting, coordinating and funding services for over 1250 individuals of all ages with developmental disabilities. Everything from early intervention and education opportunities for children to employment and community inclusive living for adults.
